

COVID Catch Up Funding Plan 2020-2021

Catch- up funding is £23,040 & Top-up funding from Swale Academies Trust is £5,053. The purpose of this funding is to identify children who have significantly fallen behind as a result of having their schooling year halted by COVID in 2020 and take remedial actions. The funding will allow the school to coordinate a catch up plan which may include additional support intervention and additional technology over time.
