We have been learning about the life cycle of a ladybird. In class we have been lucky enough to watch our own ladybirds grow from eggs to larvae, and now some have turned to pupa. We have been excitedly checking everyday to see if our ladybirds are fully grown. We have created our own work on the ladybird life cycle which is hanging proudly in the classroom.

We have been reading 'What the Ladybird heard' by Julia Donaldson. In the story, the thieves use a map of the farm to navigate their way round - which inspired us to create our own farmyard map. Before we started, we gained an understanding of local farms in kent, using google maps to discover what crops are grown and what animals are kept.



























We were really excited to be visited by the author James Jefferson. He was able to share with us all of his knowledge on space and read us one of his stories.

Maths

In Maths we have been looking at numbers beyond 10. We used cubes to explore and build towers of 11-13 and then used Numicon in a cityscape to explore numbers 14-20.











Year 1 have been working really hard towards being at school everyday; they have enjoyed choosing their prizes from the Attendance Shop.

The children have enjoyed spending time in the library, snuggled up on beanbags, reading their favourite books with their friends.

Our topic for DT is textiles, and we will be making puppets this term. Yesterday the children thoroughly enjoyed designing their puppet, cutting it out of felt and pinning the two pieces together. The children were extremely sensible doing this!















Palm class have begun to explore the concept of survival in the animal kingdom. To provide a hands-on learning experience, the young scientists have taken on the responsibility of caring for a group of stick insects. Each day, a different child is tasked with nurturing and observing these creatures, gaining valuable insights into their behaviour and survival strategies. They have loved being responsible and caring!





KS1 had a visitor last week: James the Astronaut, who taught the children about space. He read one of his stories to the children and got them to act out parts of the story. At the end of the session, the children had the opportunity to have their books signed. They all had a wonderful morning!



















It has been a great first two weeks back, full of some amazing learning! In English we have been writing a formal letter to complain about the state of the Istead Rise shelter that we have to use when there is a Kaiju (giant monster like Godzilla) attack and comparing it to a much nicer shelter in Gravesend. The children have worked really hard on ensuring that their use of English is standard and formal in these sessions and seem to have really enjoyed the subject matter. In Maths we have been learning about decimals, focusing on tenths and hundredths and their fraction equivalent, as well as dividing one and two digit numbers by ten. In Science we have started our learning about plants, beginning with the different parts of a plant and the conditions needed by different plants so that they will grow successfully. In DT we have looked at several different designs of torches and have now designed our own torches to fit with a specific audience criteria. In Music this week we started to learn the song Blackbird by The Beatles, and will continue this (including adding instruments) over the course of this term. In History we have learnt about different types of castle and have started looking in to the history of Dover castle - which will lead into our trip at the end of the term. If you have not completed the form for the trip yet, please ensure you do as soon as possible.



Sycamore class have made a fantastic start to term 5 and are enjoying the themed learning around the rainforest. In English we are just drafting our narrative poem about the rainforest layers, the children have worked hard to describe the various layers using figurative language. We continue the theme of the rainforest in geography and the children were thrilled to be using an atlas to find out information. In maths we have just finished our work on fractions and are moving onto learning about money. There was a lot of excitement in science around the unusual plants that we are going to be looking

after. Please look at the photo below for the names of plants. The children had lots of discussion about plants as they dissected a marigold to understand the different parts of a flowering plant. We used atlases again to learn that plants come from different places around the world.





































Year 3 will be visiting the Forest this term. We will focus on flora and fauna. This links in nicely to their class Science lessons where they are learning all about plants. This week we used the Outdoor Classroom for our session. This space allows us to explore a different part of the school. The children were excited to go on a Bug Hunt, looking for worms, snails, slugs and millipedes. Some of the class chose to make a clay model of a minibeast. When exploring flora, some of the children started to make a forest craft flower using two sticks and some wool. First, they weaved the wool around the two sticks. A longer stick acting as

the stem. George managed to finish his this week by adding the leaves. Others will be able to finish thiers in the next session.









Year 6 have been busy in preparation for SATs. They have been working very hard and we're really proud of them. Keep it up, Aspen! Well done to so many of you who completed revision work at home during the Easter break.

In English, we have been busy finishing our descriptions of a bombed street in The Blitz. We have now moved on and will be writing a set of humorous instructions about how to be a Victorian pickpocket!









Years 5 and 6 had a visit from Kent Police last week. Kent Police delivered an interesting and informative assembly, covering a range of topics relevant to both year groups. Lots of children came up with some really good questions and were keen to share their experiences.

Year 5 have had a brilliant start to term 5.
They've been working hard in English, learning how to write a descriptive narrative and in maths we have been learning about line graphs in statistics.

We have also started a new topic in history: World War I and the children have been undertaking their own historical research to find out about the causes of the war,









