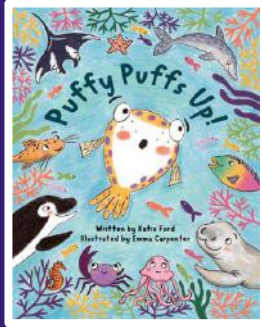

Using AI to alter images

AI (artificial intelligence) is used to create or modify images, for example it could be used to swap faces, change expressions or for more dramatic reasons, such as to remove objects. These images are often very realistic and are therefore difficult to see that they are fake.

What are AI image generators and moderation tools?

It is when artificial intelligence is used to create or modify images, for example it could be used to swap faces, change expressions or for more dramatic reasons, such as to remove objects. These images are often very realistic and are therefore difficult to see that they are fake.

Privacy concerns and consent

If your child is using these tools, they need to be aware of potential loss of privacy and the importance of consent. They should know that they should only use images of other people with consent.

What does my child need to know about using these tools?

- Children should know AI tools to manipulate images of school staff. Even if the staff consent to it, it is not recommended that they use tools to create or edit photos of teachers under any circumstances.
- Manipulation of images of friends or other children of whom you are using images of other people, then consent must always be sought.
- These tools should not be used to create images that can embarrass or hurt others. This is a form of cyberbullying.
- Copyright issues - sometimes the copyright? These images could be re-used by others, which can affect their own digital footprint.

What should I do?

- Chat to your child if they are using these tools and explain the reason why. Ask them to show you the images that they have created.
- Check the age ratings of any apps before letting your child to use and set up necessary parental controls.
- Develop your child's digital literacy by teaching them to recognise online risks and to behave responsibly online.

Year 1



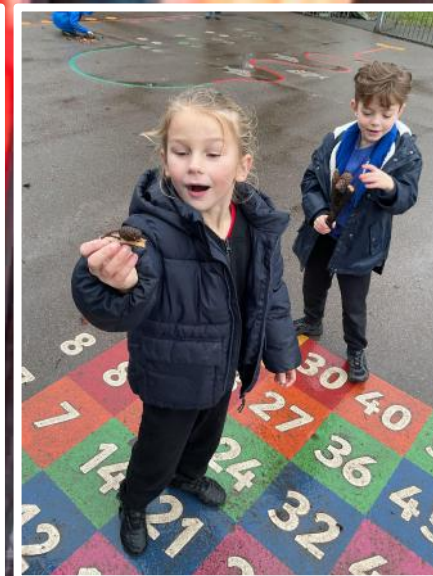
This term the children have been enjoying using computers. They have shown lots of perseverance and are now successfully logging themselves in independently. While on the computers they have learnt how to type a list on a word document and design a rocket on sketch pad. In the last lesson the children used their plans to make their rockets.



Year 1



Year 1 children have really enjoyed their DT project this term. They have designed their own Little Red Riding Hood or wolf finger puppets. The children have shown great perseverance cutting out the material, pinning it together and adding the finishing touches, being careful not to glue all four sides!



To celebrate the final week of Term 3, Year 2 took the chance to enjoy a week of deep-dive learning. In Art, we explored the world of environmental artist Andy Goldsworthy. Inspired by his use of the Great Outdoors, the children foraged for leaves, twigs, and other natural objects around the school to create their own stunning natural sculptures. It was a wonderful way to see their creativity flourish in the slightly disappointing weather.



The children have been working hard this last two weeks of term. They have just finished writing a diary entry about Mary Anning the paleontologist. Maths we have just completed our unit on length and perimeter. Science we explored if rock formation impacts on properties. We looked at some fossils and investigated what soil is made from. In history we concluded our learning about Ancient Greece. We finished the term with learning about Spain and enjoying an amazing superclass afternoon!



Year 4



It's hard to believe that we've reached the end of Term 3! As you would probably expect, it's been a very busy time in Year 4, with some amazing learning happening.

In English we have now completed our draft story about the young boy finding the dragon in the cave, with a great emphasis on using a range of fronted adverbials to avoid repeating the same sentence starters.

In maths we have completed our unit on perimeter by finding the missing lengths of shapes, calculating the perimeter of rectilinear shapes and also the perimeter of regular polygons.

In Science we have completed our learning on States of Matter and completed the end of unit quiz.

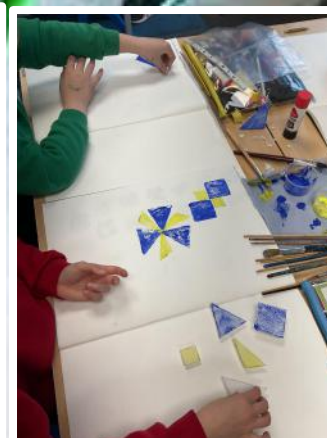
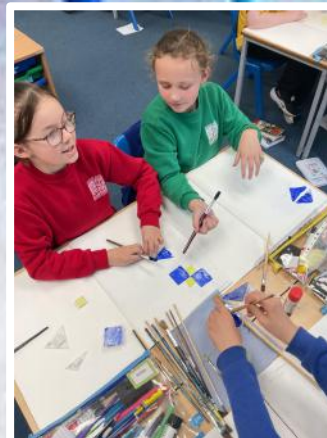
This week in RE we looked at the difference between pilgrimage and tourism, as well as refreshing our knowledge on the importance of the River Ganges to Hindus.

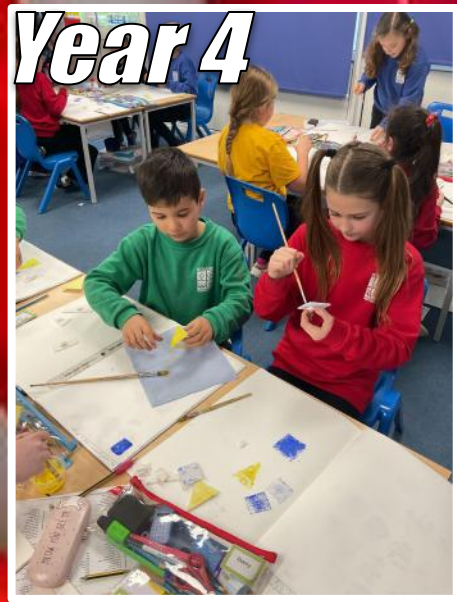
In Computing we worked on completing our websites, including a home page and pages which were linked to the images. It was quite a challenging task, but the children worked extremely hard and their amazing work can be accessed from the links in the stream on our google classroom page.

In art we used the geometric pattern printing blocks which we made in the last lesson to print repeating patterns. The results were very good and some of the children were really surprised at how well their blocks printed.

In their daily MTC practice, the children have shown great progress and perseverance, with three different Battle Champions being crowned this week. Please encourage your children to continue to practice their tables using TTRS or Emile over the half-term break so that their skills and memory remain sharp. Children who are taking part in my MTC Club next term will be told which times tables they need to focus on for each session and these will be written in their planners ahead of time.

Year 5

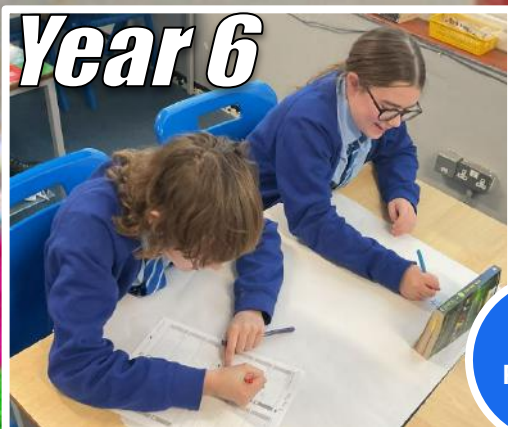
