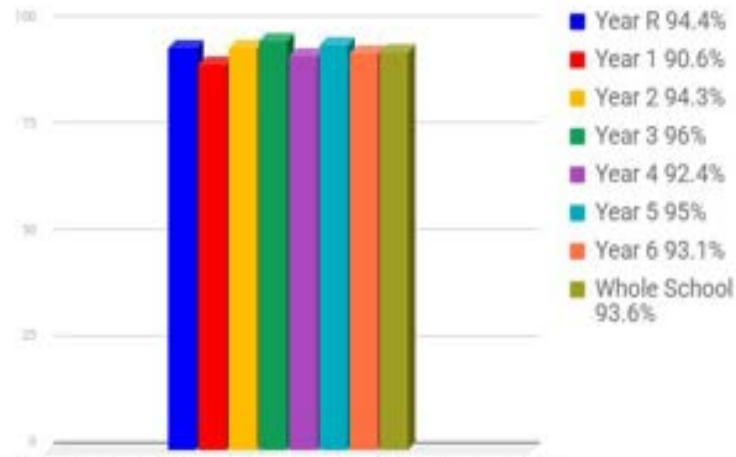

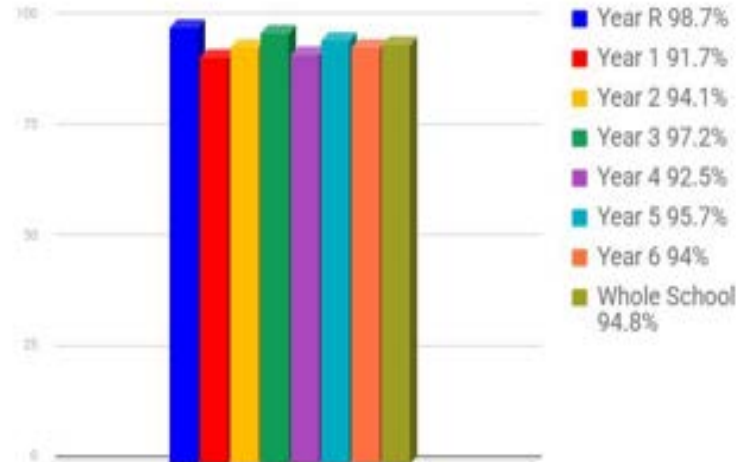


## Holidays during Term-Time

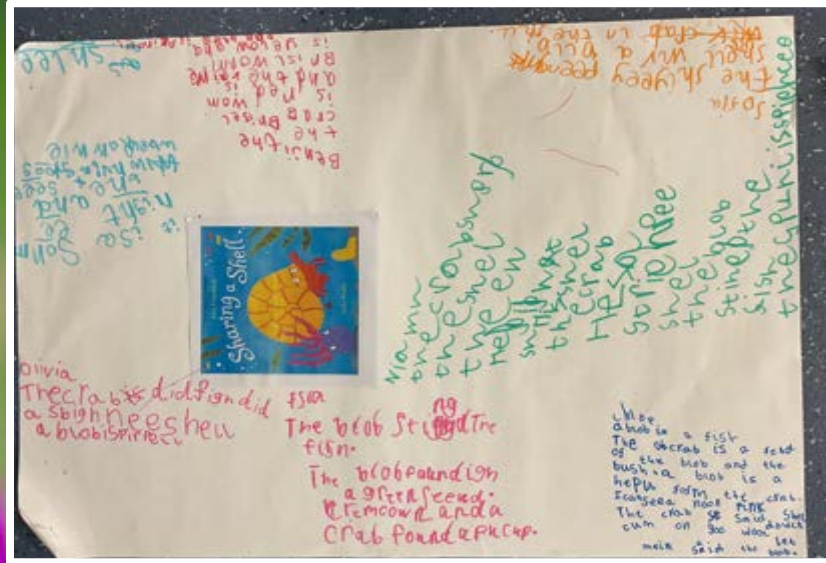


# Year R



For our final term in Reception we are going to be very busy. Our topic this term is exploring 'Under the Sea'. We will be looking at different types of beaches, habitats, sea creatures and water safety. We will secure this knowledge at our exciting trip to the Sea Life Centre.

**English** - Our first story of the term was 'Sharing a Shell'. We were able to retell the story through role play, using masks and our incredible acting skills to act out the story. The children were brilliant and thoroughly enjoyed this activity.



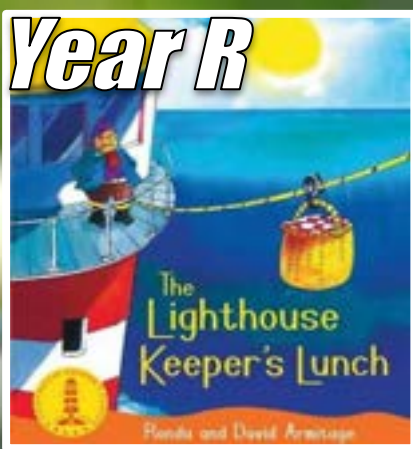
The children have continued to explore writing each week using big paper. We are able to explore different sentences, and discuss the story and our ideas with our tables. Their writing is fantastic and we are extremely proud of them.



In **Maths** we have continued to explore patterns, looking at what a repeat pattern rule is. The children created their own repeat pattern rules.



In our area of **Understanding of the World** we completed a science experiment of floating and sinking in salt water and tap water. The children have begun to develop their foundational science skills - making predictions, carrying out the experiment and then evaluating. They had so much fun and were all shocked that salt water and tap water cause different reactions.



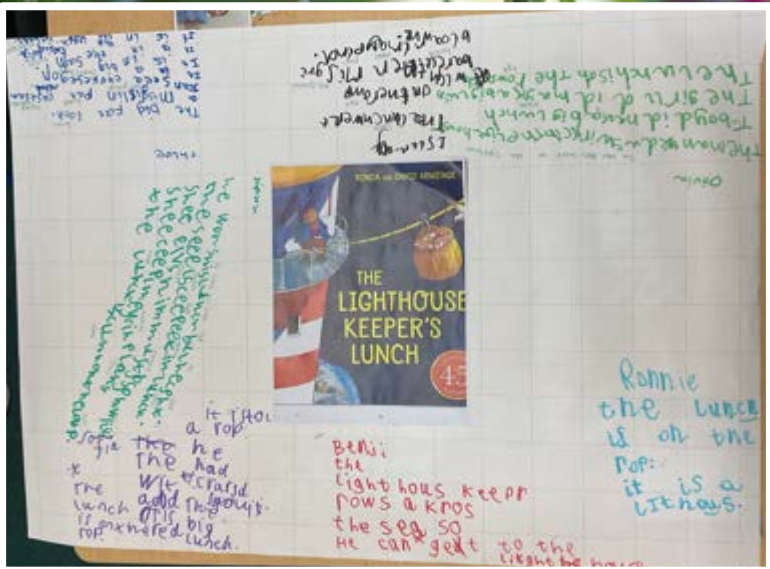
## Show and Tell

We encourage children to take part in show and tell to develop their communication and language skills, as well as their confidence. Our Show and Tell basket is always overflowing with home learning, interesting facts, books, days out, favourite toys and special achievements.

**English:** This week we have been looking at the story of 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. The children have really enjoyed this story and found the seagulls to be very cheeky. We used storyboards to retell the story, practising our turn taking skills and ability to discuss together.



We have continued to explore our own interest in provision - creating, making, designing and engaging role play.



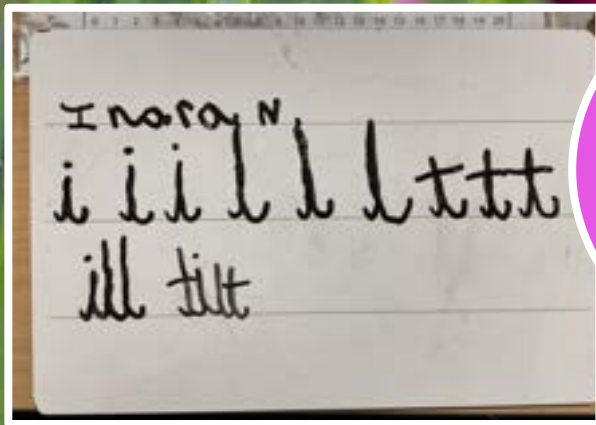
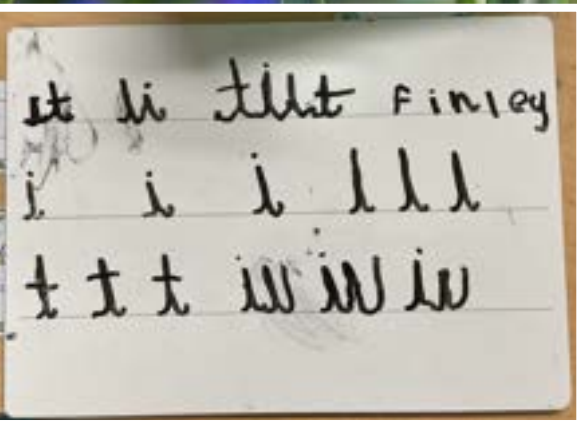
# Year R

We have been busy practising for our first Sports Day event!

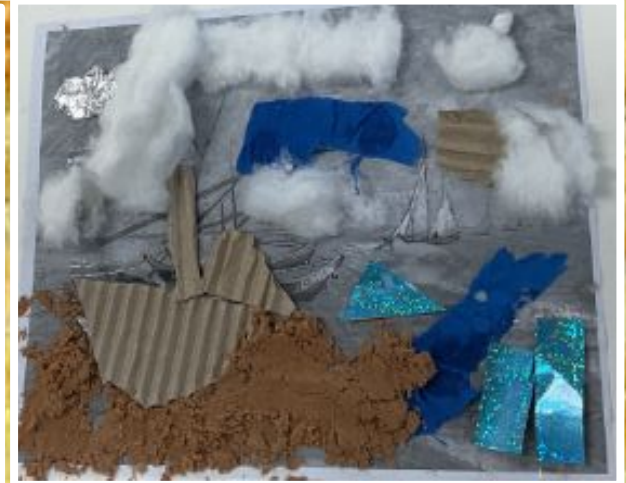


This week we have started to practise cursive writing ready for our transition to Year 1. The children have been fantastic and very enthusiastic to learn!





This term in Art the children have been exploring different ways of using materials to create landscapes. They have been looking at Vincent Van Gogh for inspiration. This week they have been creating their own shipwreck beach scene using their imagination and materials such as different textures of paper, plastics and sand. They were very proud of their creations!





Year 2 has dived straight into an exciting new Science topic: Plants! This term, our learning is moving out of the classroom and into the outdoors as we use the KS1 garden to get some practical experience watching nature at work.

To kickstart our horticultural journey, the children rolled up their sleeves this week for some essential preparation.

Working as a team, they cleared out old, dead plants to carefully dig over the soil.

This hands-on process allowed us to talk about the importance of soil and what seeds and plants need to successfully germinate. Later this term, we will be planting fresh seeds and tracking their growth week by week. We cannot wait to see our hard work bloom into a thriving, colorful garden!



# Year 3



Year 3 have made a fantastic start to the final term. In English we are learning about Jacques Cousteau. In Maths we have just started our unit on shape and thinking about clockwise and anticlockwise turns. In Science we continue to focus on plants. We are observing how a bean seed grows and have just set up an investigation, the ways in which water is transported within plants.



We talked about how liquid added to soil, reaches all parts of the plant through a tiny straw-like system inside the plant called the xylem.

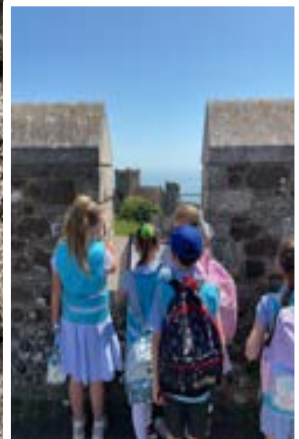
We set up two experiments to observe changes: Celery experiment & carnations in different coloured water. In Geography we have started our learning about the extreme earth and identified the earth's layers.





We ended Term 5 with a very successful visit to Dover Castle, which brought together all of our learning in History and Geography from Terms 1 - 5.

This term we have been writing a detailed description in English based on elements from the movie Tron. In Maths we have learnt how to convert money and how to use the four operations with decimal notation for money. In Science we have continued our unit on habitats, looking this week at global habitats. We have now completed the Official MTC Check, and all of the children really gave it their best effort - so well done!

Year 5 have made a fantastic start to Term 6!

In English, the children have been diving into the world of debate by writing balanced arguments responding to the thought-provoking question, 'Should Zoos be banned?' This topic has really got everyone thinking deeply about their own beliefs and has sparked some brilliant, respectful discussions across the classroom. Meanwhile, we have kicked off our new topic on angles in maths, where the children have been busy classifying, estimating, and measuring various angles. Our outdoor learning has been just as exciting.

In PE, we have started our Outdoor Adventurous Activities (OAA) lessons. These have been great fun so far, with the children thoroughly enjoying working as teams and using their problem-solving skills to locate different items around the grounds.

To top it all off, we were lucky enough to take part in a brilliant music workshop. The children learned how to navigate the keyboard notes, successfully mastered playing both 'Baby Shark' and the 'Minecraft' theme tune, and even got creative by composing some of their very own tunes.

# Year 6



Year 6 have been busy writing recently. For this sequence in English, we focused on writing a description about a scene from the film 'The Greatest Showman'. We found high level vocabulary and created some great sentences using figurative language. The final pieces were very well written and Year 6 should be very proud of themselves.

This week, we did a careers lesson focused on the job of an architect. Year 6 looked at the different factors architects need to consider when building a house and why these are important. They then worked in groups; taking on the role of the client, architect and builder. They then worked together to build the houses using paper.

In PE, we did a few practice races - getting ready for sports day. We have also been focusing on OAA (Outdoor Adventurous Activities) which has been lots of fun. This requires a lot of teamwork and communication which Year 6 are learning each week.
