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

Stay and play

The children had a wonderful time with their parents, carers and grandparents during stay and play. They completed an array of activities including leaf printing, weaving, leaf rubbing, autumn tree paintings and autumn hedgehogs. It was wonderful to see so many adults engaging with the children.

















Say no to racism -Acorn class took part in 'Say No To Racism'. The children have all been learning a lot about each other and how everyone is unique. There were lots of lovely conversations and some very touching moments.



The children really enjoyed their visit to the Gurdwara at the end of last term. The ladies who showed the children around were very impressed with the children's knowledge of Sikhism and their behaviour around the temple.

This term in Science we are continuing our focus on animals including humans. We have sorted the animals according to their characteristics.





As part of our Sikhism lessons in RE, we had a great time making chapatis. We rolled the dough, cooked the chapatis and enjoyed eating them while learning about Sikh traditions. We discovered that during Diwali, Sikhs come together to enjoy delicious food in a feast. It was a fun and tasty experience for the class!











The children have made a fantastic start to term 2. In maths we are in our final week of learning about addition and subtraction. The children are learning to estimate by rounding and using column addition and subtraction to answer questions. They have also been learning the inverse (opposite) operation eg: 105 + 59 = 164 and 164 - 59 = 105. In English we have watched a video clip and will be writing a fictional story based on the clip, we worked in groups to produce some collaborative ideas which can be developed. In R.E. we are learning about

Christianity and will be focusing on creation stories this term. Electricity is the theme for science this term and the children enjoyed exploring electrical appliances thinking about health and safety.













Last term we showed racism the red card by wearing red to school and this term in PSHE we will be discussing how we are different through our theme celebrating difference.









We've had a great start to Term 2! In English we are writing a narrative based on The Time Machine by HG Wells, and have also used a graphic novel version of the book for guided reading. In Maths this week, we have been looking at how to find the area of a rectangle using squares, and next week we will move onto our Multiplication and Division unit which will run for the rest of the term. In Science we have started our new unit on Electricity, looking initially at what electricity is and what it can power. This term in RE we are looking at pilgrimages for Christianity, while in Art we are looking at light and shade in drawing and painting. And of course we have our trip to the theatre in a few weeks to look forward to!









Willow had a really exciting last week of term 1. They made lunar habitats for Black History Month after learning about Katherine Johnson, an African-American mathematician whose calculations of orbital mechanics were critical to the lunar spaceflights. They also visited the Gurdwara in Gravesend with year 1. The day was fantastic and the children really enjoyed it. They've also been busy printing in art and learning about musical notation in music lessons.















ASPAN

Welcome back, Year 6! The hard work has started already - you have had a great first week back.

In Maths, we have continued with division. This week, the children learnt the method for long division as well as the BODMAS method to work out the order of operations in a question.

In History, we have started our Victorians topic. Year 6 loved the first lesson; they had



so many questions to ask and bits of information to share. We looked at events that happened in Britain during the Victorian era as well as learning about the British Empire. For this topic, we have a loan box with different artefacts in from Maidstone Museum which we have had a brief look at so far. The children were interested to see some of the items and compared the modern-day washing machine to a bowl and mangle!
