





Transported back to the year 1666, they fully immersed themselves in the historical drama, acting out scenes and experiencing life during that significant period. The hands-on activity not only made learning about history enjoyable but also proved to be an effective way to gain more knowledge of the event!































Year 2 had another great week of adventures in the forest. The Sugar Plum Fairy was our guest behind the elf door this time. The children listened with anticipation when I read them a story. Following this, the class used plums to make bird feeders. The class also used the reef knot they have been learning to tie, so they could hang them up in the trees for the birds to enjoy.











It's been a very busy two weeks! We have now completed our instructions on how to operate the Time Booth from Bill and Ted's Excellent Adventure. We have now moved on to our next narrative, which is based on the race towards the Clock Tower from Back to the Future. Our school trip last week to see Back to the Future the musical has really enthused the children in this writing. In maths we are continuing to work through our unit on multiplication and division and are continuing to complete our daily MTC check each morning. Please continue to encourage your child to keep learning their tables, especially any that they are still unsure of. In science we are continuing our work on electricity, and have looked at conductors and insulators in a circuit. In history we have now finished our work on Alfred the Great and Edward the Confessor which leaves us the Battle of Hastings in 1066 still to cover next week. In art we are continuing to look at tints and shades in painting and the children have produced some excellent paintings using tints and shades of a colour in a 3D object.

We are continuing to learn our Christmas carols and rehearse for the carol concert and look forward to welcoming you to the church next Wednesday afternoon. No Pens Day was a huge success, with the children talking about a huge range of different topics based on the items they brought in.

These were written from the point of view of a Victorian child and really captured the poor conditions that children lived in, as well as the feelings and events associated with this. Great work Year 6!

In Spanish, Year 6 have been learning how to talk about what they do at the weekend. There have been some great conversations going on during the lesson and the class are really progressing with their Spanish speaking skills.
