The children are really enjoying this term's topic for Art, which is learning about 3D sculptures.

In Maths this week we have been learning about the place value of numbers and identifying the value of each digit. In English, we have been researching information about our favourite authors and writing a biography about them.

Happy New Year! The children have started the term with an amazing attitude and maturity. Over the past week they have shown they can work well together sharing ideas and working cooperatively. Our first sequence of learning this year for English is a newspaper report. In maths we continue to learn multiplication and division facts. We are learning about the Greeks in History. In Art we are thinking about using 2D shapes to make 3D shapes. This term in Science, we are learning about animals, including humans. In our first lesson, we will identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons for support.

Welcome back! It's been a great start to the new term and new year. In English we have started our first narrative sequence, which is based on noir detective fiction. The children have been working really hard to capture the correct tone for their detective in their descriptive phrases! In Guided Reading we have been looking at an extract from The Secret Diary of Snow White, which has been quite amusing so far. In Maths we are continuing to work on multiplication and division, in particular looking at what happens to numbers when we multiply and divide by 10 and 100. In Art we have looked at 'big' sketches, working in coloured crayon to complete sketches of vases.

In RE we have continued our work on Hinduism and have looked at shared beliefs and the different aspects of Brahman.





















Since the start of term 3 the children have been busy learning all about Gertrude Ederle, the first woman to swim the English Channel.

They have been learning all of the skills needed to write a biography in their English lessons about her life and achievements.

In maths they have been continuing to learn about fractions and have been working extremely hard to add and subtract mixed numbers and improper fractions with different denominators.

Our new topic this term in science is electricity and the class had fun making some basic circuits on Thursday.









Year 6 have been writing an essay for our first learning sequence of 2024. So far, we have looked at the features of an essay, carried out purposeful research and created a plan. In the essay, the children will compare a Victorian childhood with a 21st century childhood.

In PSHE, Year 6 have set themselves two goals - one for at school and one for at home. This week, we will be looking at the steps needed to achieve those goals.

In Science, we have started our electricity topic. This week, we looked at basic circuits and the symbols for those circuits. The children made their own circuits using a variety of equipment and enjoyed problem solving when their bulb would not light up!

























Happy New Year everyone. At Forest School this term, Year 5 will be working on their knots and lashings to build bridges, structures and stickmen as well as identifying a different tree each week from a stickman. This week I saw lots of perseverance (one of our core values) whilst the class worked in groups to construct a bridge. The bridges had to be at least a foot off the ground and be able to hold at least two of the children in the group. Everyone worked so well, and as a result the groups built strong and sturdy bridges. So much so, I was able to stand on one of them. Mrs Sandhu also had a lot of fun when she climbed our climbing tree.
