






- Passengers aged 14 and above are responsible for their own belts.
- Children MUST use a child car seat until they are 12 years old, or 135cm tall whichever comes first.
- Drivers caught not wearing a seat belt can be fined up

Road safety experts recommend ALL childrenunder 150cm should use a child car seat.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

Be secure

Always wear your seat belt in any vehicle where available. Protect other people

Make sure everyone else wears their seat belt, on every journey. Children smaller than 150cm should use a child car seat.

Spread the word

Explain the risks of not wearing friends and family.

It has been brought to our attention by concerned parents, that they have witnessed that some of our children at Istead Rise are not wearing their seat belt on their journey to and from school. We urge all parents to keep their children safe on car journeys as they would at other times.



Kids Eat Out For Less

February Half Term 2024

The highlight of their day was the numbers workshop, they had to put their problem-solving skills to the test and work together to find solutions! It was a day full of fun and learning!

Our young scientists have been diligently researching animals and their habitats, then using their

newfound knowledge to design their own habitats. Each creation reflects their understanding of their chosen animal's needs and preferences. It's been inspiring to see their dedication to learning in action!





















Sycamore class enjoyed numbers day last week and took part in a variety of problem solving and reasoning challenges. In maths, the children have finished the topic length and perimeter. In English they have finished learning about Mary Anning and have written a diary entry. Art, the children worked with large materials in groups to apply what they have learned about abstract sculpture and constructed their own artwork inspired by playground equipment. In science they explored the mouth and identified different types of teeth in humans and their simple functions. We had great fun using the giant teeth model and dental mirrors. We also identified which teeth to use when we eat different foods. Our history topic about the Greeks ended with a fantastic VR experience.
























Over the past two weeks we have continued to work hard! In English we have been working on our final writing sequence for this term, writing a newspaper report based on the arrest of the master-criminal Goldilocks. In Maths we have now completed our sequence on multiplying and dividing and will begin next term by working on perimeter. In Science we have been learning about the muscles and how they contract and relax so that we can move, and this week looked at the role that our different types of teeth have. Last week we took part in the National Finals of the Emile MTC world cup. The children did brilliantly, coming 4th out of 60 schools. They can be proud of their achievements, as even though we came 3rd in the previous competition, this time our percentage of correct answers and overall score was much higher. In History we have completed our work on Vikings, ending with the expeditions to Greenland and Newfoundland.

















Willow class has been enjoying lots of different activities in the past few weeks. On Numbers Day the children came in wearing some amazing costumes and took part in a fantastic puzzle solving workshop. They have also been learning about electricity in science and have been building circuits during lessons.
















This week in Science, Year 6 have been busy testing out voltage on a variety of components.

We investigated how changing the voltage in a circuit affects the output of the component. Year 6 also tried out a new component - a buzzer!


In Maths we have been learning how to convert between different units of measure, as well as our daily arithmetic practise.
