Dear Istead Rise Families,


















Expressive Arts and Design

Acorns class has thoroughly enjoyed the story Stickman by Julia Donaldson. This has by far been their best story. First, the children listened to the story and then they retold it using props. Some children wrote cvc words using sticks. Next, the children went on a walk around the school to collect sticks. Then, they used resources to help them make a stick person. Once their person was made, the children went on to the school's field to make a home for their stick person. They then wrote some fantastic character descriptions!







































































Maths

Prepositional language is an important area of learning for all children. It refers to the place where something or someone is, often in relation to other things, such as: over, under, beside or beneath. Teaching children positional words builds their ability to follow and give directions and use language accurately. As we have been reading the story of the 'Smeds and Smoos', we used props from the story to encourage the children to physically locate the positions. Once this was achieved, the children used prepositional language in PE to support their contextual understanding. For example, "I am going over the hurdle".









Understanding of The World as we have been learning
about Aliens through our story
'Smeds and Smoos' we
wanted to make alien lava
lamps. To do this, we worked
with an adult to mix oil, water
and food colouring. We were
so amazed to see how the
solutions separated.








Writing

To further our learning of The Smeds and The Smoos, we imagined what we would take with us on a trip to The Moon. We included things like toys (incase we got bored), a camera (to take photos) and snacks (incase we got hungry).

We also used the tuff tray to retell the story.















Expressive Arts and Design

It has been lovely to see the the children making friendship hands through discovering the effects of mixing different coloured paint in class. They chose a colour, dipped their hands in the paint and then shook their partners hand. They really enjoyed this activity and have consolidated their learning of colour mixing.



Year 2 have continued to enjoy their learning this term! In R.E, we learnt that Buddhists drink green tea to help clear their minds when they meditate. We looked at, smelt and tasted some for ourselves and lots of us found it really tasty!

We have completed our Art learning for the term by making our final clay house tiles and decorating them with the patterns and techniques we have learnt. Some of our favourites were using Lego bricks to make door shapes and pegs to look like roof tiles.







In Science, we made catapults this week using lolly sticks, spoons and tape. The children started off by designing their own catapult, thinking carefully about how it would work. After we finished making them, we took them outside on the playground to test how far they would work!













Well, what another busy 2 weeks it has been for Year 1! We have been involved with lots of STEM activities; making parachutes, building a bear enclosure as well as previous learning on finding the correct consistency for a sand castle and the correct material for making a blackout blind. In music, our end of topic lesson was playing the glockenspiels in time to the music 'Round and Round'. In Maths, the children have been comparing the mass of objects using weighing scales and the length and height of objects using rulers and cubes. For Art, our project has been 3D sculptures and our final lesson was painting our 3D SPIDER!! We hope you all have a superb Easter break and look forward to another incredibly busy and fun term.

















The children took part in various activities and the English Heritage experts were incredible when delivering their workshop. There were opportunities to look at Roman artefacts and learn about them, as well as complete a puzzle. During our visit, the children were able to dress up in Roman clothes and make some mosaics using coloured tesserae. The children really enjoyed their visit and learnt a lot about

We have also finished learning about Buddhism in R.E. and the children were able to discuss key elements of the religion. In science we have finished two terms of learning about living things and their habitats which concluded with children drawing posters about the environment. The children loved their final art lesson making a sculpture. After half term we move onto D.T.

We have been very busy revising and this week, have made our own revision books to help us with our learning.

Mrs Brown and Miss Waters have been really impressed with the perseverance and determination that Year 6 are showing with their revision work. So many of you are completing lots of work at home also which is great, so please continue!

We have just finished our final learning
Sequence for English this term. Year 6
wrote a 'balanced argument' about whether zoos should
be closed down or not. We were very impressed with the
high level of writing in the final drafts, as well as the use
of formal and technical language. Well done Year 6.













We have now come to the end of our current English sequence, where we have been writing a narrative based on the picture book 'Chalk' - focussing on the section where the T-Rex is in the playground. We have drawn on a wealth of sophisticated vocabulary, including looking at descriptions from A Sound of Thunder and Jurassic Park. In Maths we have spent this week looking at statistics, including line graphs, tables and timetables and how we can use the data to answer questions. In computing we have been creating our own stop motion animation films, where we realised just how long and how many photos you need to complete even a minute of action. The children have worked very hard on these, and we hope to be able to share some of them with you soon.





Friends of the Forest
