
Dear Istead Rise families,

We have been learning facts about ladybugs. Acorns class asked questions such as:

- Do ladybugs sleep?
- Why do they have spots?
- Do ladybugs have teeth?
- How do ladybugs fly?
- Is a ladybug a bug?

The children found the answers to these questions by using range of media to help them. They then created some lovely fact files!

#### **Nutrition**

As we have been learning all about ladybugs, we thought it would be such a good idea to make a ladybug using healthy food. The children had so much fun on their school trip to Wingham Wildlife Park last week. They saw lots of different animals from all over the globe such as meerkats, lemurs, tigers, pandas, tarantulas and beetles. They watched the otters being fed and saw just how clever they were when they were asked to jump onto a log, stretch up tall and touch the end of a long pole with their nose. After the otter feeding, the children visited minibeast land where they were shocked to see the minibeasts were in fact larger than them! A fun day out was had by all, with singing on the coach to complete the day.

confidence and social skills. It was lovely to see the children having a great time.






























We have had another very busy two weeks of school. The children thoroughly enjoyed our trip to Wingham Wildlife Park and are busy writing a recount about their trip...look out for this in the next newsletter! During maths, we have been learning about capacity and volume and working out how we could measure. In science, we are looking at plants and what they need to grow. The children have been walking around the school grounds, taking photos of their favourite plants.

This week we have also started designing a moving story book which we will be testing out on Reception class.





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Last week, Year 2 had a fantastic time at Wingham Wildlife Park. We enjoyed seeing all of the different animals that were there and being able to take some time out of the classroom to have fun together. Some of our favourites were the cheeky meerkats and the penguins who were out on a walk, so could some right up to our feet!

The children were all amazing during the day and all of the adults were very proud of them! Since being back at school this week, we have been using our knowledge and experiences during the trip to write a recount in English lessons. We have worked hard to put events in chronological order and will start to add time conjunctions to our writing too. In Science, we have been learning all about animals and their habitats. This week, we sorted different animals into their habitats by placing them on picture mats before discussing why they were suited to living there over the other choices.






















Cherry have made a fantastic start to Term 5 working hard in all lessons. Mrs Baker and Mrs Flatman have been particularly impressed with their commitment to do well in times table challenges. In history the children used computers to research information about why Dover Castle was built (1066). Our design technology project this term is to design and make a cushion. The children enjoyed choosing their materials and cutting out a pattern to go on the front. In science we are learning about light. Our investigation - What's in the box? saw the children place 8 objects under a box and slowly make holes in different positions to allow light to travel in. We concluded that darkness is the absence of light and we are dependent on light to see. As part of our English this term we are learning a poem to recite called 'Rap Connected'. In our learning sequence we are writing a poem based on the Cheshire cat from Alice in Wonderland. In maths we have just finished our work on decimals and will move onto money next week.

# Sycamore

Sycamore has settled back into Term 5 really well and have been working extremely hard.

In English we are learning about poetry and the children have been developing skills to help them write their own. The metaphors they all came up with this week were absolutely amazing! We are also learning a poem called 'Jaguar' off by heart to help the children understand how poetry should be spoken or performed.

In maths we have been working on fractions and even though it has been a bit challenging at times, they have all persevered really well.

We have also started DT this term and the children are working towards making their own flying toy .





So far this term, we have been working through our first

English sequence of a narrative journal, based on a planet similar to Pandora in the movie Avatar. The children have really enjoyed this unit and have produced some excellent descriptive writing. In maths we have been learning about angles and how to measure and draw them with a protractor, and how to calculate a missing angle around a point and also on a straight line. In DT we have been designing a flying toy that will need to have a propellor

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powered by an elastic band, which has been quite a challenge! This week we took part in a writing workshop with our visiting author, and worked through the planning of a story around a main character.



# Elm & Aspen

Another busy week for Year 6!

SATs are fast approaching and we have been continuing with our revision. Mrs Brown and Miss Waters have been very impressed with Elm and Aspen's dedication and hard work. For our Maths revision, we have been focusing on remembering and practicing key methods for the arithmetic paper. We have also been practicing reasoning papers - looking at how to answer 2 and 3 step questions and remembering how to break down each question. We have also been recapping how to accurately measure angles with a protractor.

For our reading revision, we have been looking at past papers and really picking apart what the questions are asking us to do. We have also been practicing answering '3 mark' questions; ensuring our answers have enough evidence from the text and a clear explanation.

In our current English sequence, we are writing a persuasive formal letter. So far, we have looked at the features of a persuasive formal letter, recapped and used persuasive techniques and will soon be drafting our own persuasive letters. Watch this space!

Please continue with revision at home - even just 20 minutes a day will be beneficial. Well done for your hard work, Year 6.


