

It's time to investigate fish and other things that live and can be found in the sea. While we learn about the different types of fish and shells, we can write about them and include some adjectives!
























Year 1 have had an extremely busy couple of weeks. In Science they are learning about types of trees and enjoyed going for a search in the school grounds. They have been completing a plant diary and their plants are growing tremendously. In Computing, they have built their own rockets after learning what they needed to include. Also, they have made clay pots using the snake method during art.















In Year 2, we have been working hard in English to write our information texts on different nocturnal animals. We have used the chromebooks to research facts about them and put the information into separate subheadings. We have made sure to use a variety of adjectives, fronted adverbials and conjunctions to write our sentences and make it interesting for others to read.

In maths we have continued the theme of nocturnal animals by looking at different ways we can present data. We each voted for our favourite animal before making a tally chart, a pictogram and a bar chart to show the information. We have had lots of fun interpreting and comparing the data by answering questions on it.

We have also recently finished our learning on Sikhism in R.E by making tasty coconut squares used to celebrate Diwali. We worked together in groups to carefully follow a recipe. It was very sticky and we had to concentrate on measuring accurately, but was worth it for a delicious treat in the end!




























Since we came back to school last week we have been busy using lots of amazing vocabulary to describe the White Witch in The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe. The children have written some amazing character descriptions and we are very proud of them.

The children have been looking forward to taking part in their science lesson this week where they are learning about the human digestive system. They mulched up food and passed it through tights, just like intestines! This was probably the highlight of their week- they had a lot of fun!

In maths we have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes, angles and turns. Even though they found this challenging, they have all persevered well.

Year 5 had a wonderful time last week on our theatre trip to see 'Frozen the Musical'! We were so impressed with the singing, acting, dancing, and stage effects! Some

In Maths, we have just started our next sequence which is focused on fractions, decimals and percentages. We are about to start looking at the local History of Gravesend very soon, which we hope will be interesting.



In Computing, we have started a new topic which is focussed on data. In Lesson 1 we looked at how NASA's Mars 'Curiosity' Rover communicates with Earth, how it was designed and how it travelled from Earth to Mars. We learnt some amazing facts!



Over the past few weeks many of our children in Year 5 have been taking part in their Bikeability course. The children spent the first few hours of the course on the



playground completing the Level 1 part of the course. This involved improving bike control, spacial awareness and decision making. The children were then taken onto the road to learn how to ride safely when traffic is also around. Many of our children also passed the Level 2 element of the course. Well done to everyone who participated.











We have completed the final guided reading text linked to dystopic settings, and the children have thoroughly enjoyed the range of extracts we have used.

In writing we have continued with our next writing sequence, which is a scientific-style journal based on exploring another planet, focusing on building the setting of its different areas through sophisticated vocabulary and expanded noun phrases. Rehearsals for our end of year production are continuing, and the children are doing an excellent job of learning their lines and the songs - with the whole thing now coming together nicely!
