He joined us as part of our school STEM week and we were all interested to hear about the many things he had designed and built when he was alive. 




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### The Lifecycle of a Butterfly update!

They drew a tree before blowing a variety of colours through a straw.















In Science, we have continued our learning about animals and their habitats, discussing why they live where they do and why they would not be suited to living in other environments. For the past few weeks in class, we have also been watching our caterpillars slowly form into their cocoons! They are really wiggly and we hope to see them come out as butterflies soon!

In History, to complete our learning about the Great Fire of London, we have been making our own Tudor houses. We looked at the features of a Tudor house before using cereal boxes to design and make our own. We spoke about why their designs made it easy for the fire to spread across London as quickly as it did!

# Sycamore

Sycamore spent time during their science lesson learning about the pollination process in flowering plants. We went outside and had a look at the tulips, daffodils and other Spring flowers to see if we could identify the parts of a flower important in this process. The children made some amazing posters explaining this and included some very lovely drawings of bees and flowers!

We have also been learning about fractions in maths and writing a job application letter in English. The children are currently applying for a Headteacher's job!

Cherry Class have been working hard to learn their times tables. They have successfully finished their writing sequence applying for a job as a headteacher! Maths we have finished our sequence of learning on fractions and have moved onto decimals. In Science we learned about the



# Aspen

In Year 6 we're working harder than ever!

In English we have been looking at writing formally, ensuring that our tone and vocabulary would be befitting a job application letter (we're applying to take My Payne's job!). In Guided Reading we have moved to looking at the narrative style of 'The Book Thief' and the clues we can infer about the narrator. While in Maths we have continued looking back over arithmetic skills, including fractions, decimals and percentages, alongside the properties of 3D shapes.

As we are now in the final countdown towards SATs, we would encourage the children to up their game in their use of TT Rockstars and Mathletics at home over the Easter, especially as SATSs are now only 3 school weeks away - and follow up anything they are unsure about and need extra practice on. In Science we have finished our work on light by looking at how shadows can be manipulated and predicting what we expected the shadow to be like.













Last week we had a range of new activities added to our playground! Fun & Active Playgrounds came to visit our school and installed several new playground markings for our pupils. This included a new football and basketball court, two hopscotches, two 4-square games and a two-way target.
